Pope Francis Shares Secret to Happiness—*Melissa Hicks*

In an interview published this summer in the Argentine weekly *Viva*, Pope Francis listed his Top 10 tips for bringing greater joy to one's life. One of them was: "Be giving of yourself to others."

It turns out that science supports the Pope's advice. A study published in *Social Science and Medicine* found that the more people volunteered, the happier they were. Other research has determined that the benefits of volunteering are numerous: It strengthens your connection to the community, expands your social network, increases self-esteem and helps you to develop new skills. It can even benefit your career. In fact, 41 percent of hiring authorities surveyed by LinkedIn rated volunteer experience equally as important as paid experience. Ghandi touted another benefit of volunteering when he said, "The best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others."

As if the social health benefits weren't enough, a report by the Corporation for National & Community Service titled "[The Health Benefits of Volunteering: A Review of Recent Research](#)" found that those who volunteer have lower mortality rates, greater functional ability, and lower rates of depression later in life than those who do not volunteer.

When it comes to giving selflessly, Catholic history provides us with countless inspiring role models. Perhaps one of the most famous is Mother Teresa. But we don't have to travel to the streets of Calcutta to make an impact. We can share our time and talents right here in our school community. In addition to the numerous social and health benefits, volunteering at the school provides you with the ability to meet the parents of your child's friends. And who better to teach your child about the importance of service, than you?

So if you're seeking to reap the many benefits of volunteering, please look no further than our school. We have a variety of volunteer activities, from helping in the library, supervising recess, or serving as a room mom, coach or scout leader. In addition, we host four major fundraising events, a Scholars Circle program, Popcorn Festival parking and a booth, plus Market Day—all of which are entirely run by volunteers. The revenue generated by these fundraisers is critical to our school's budget, as it helps bridge the gap between tuition and the total cost of educating each child. Without successful fundraisers, tuition would have to increase to cover the budget shortfall.

While it may be easy to simply "write the check" to cover the 40 hours of service required in the tuition contract, the benefits of volunteering outweigh the convenience. We have only one fundraising event remaining this fall, Oktoberfest, and it requires a tremendous amount of volunteer support. The standing committee chairs have been working diligently since June to make the event even better than last year's which attracted a record-breaking 800 attendees.
